

Atkins Dethrones Reyno. In All-Forsyth Track Me

Adams Sets Mark, Ties Another

Atkins was the big winner in last night's All-Forsyth track meet held at North Forsyth.

Atkins used its over-all strength and depth to score 69 points and edge Reynolds for the team championship. Reynolds had 60 points.

It was the first time that any team but Reynolds has won the meet.

North Forsyth and West Forsyth tied for third with 22 points each. East Forsyth was fifth with 20 points. Then came Parkland with 19, Carver with 9 and Anderson with 3.

Mount Tabor did not compete because of a schedule conflict.

Alfred Adams, an Atkins hurdler and relay man, was named the most outstanding athlete. Adams won the high hurdles, setting a meet record in the trials with a :15. He won the low hurdles and tied the meet record in the trials with a :20. And he ran on the mile relay team which set a meet record with a time of 3:29.9.

Weather Cold

The weather was cold for the final events at night but even so six other meet records fell and another was tied. They were:

Stan Crews of Reynolds ran a :9.75 in the 100-yard dash. The old mark of :10 was held by Crews. It is also an all-time Winston-Salem record, smashing a mark that has stood since 1948. This was the oldest record on the books.

Frank Carroll of North Forsyth won the mile in 4:34.1. The old record of 4:39.3 was set by Bruce Rose of Reynolds in 1963.

Mike Stafford of Reynolds broke the shot record with a put of 55 ft., 11 inches. The record was 52 ft., 6½ inches set by John Fagg of Hanes in 1963.

Larry Reaves of Reynolds broad jumped 21 ft., 9 in. to break the meet record of 21

Atkins' relay teams broke two records. The Camels ran the 880-yard relay in 1:31.5, breaking the record of 1:32.6, they set last year. Atkins ran the mile relay in 3:29.9, breaking the meet record time of 3:30.2 which the Camels set last year.

Bolick Wins

Buddy Bolick of West Forsyth won the 220-yard dash on a curve in :22.5. It was the first time the event has been run on a curve.

In the afternoon trials, some of the discus competitors charged that Mike Stafford of Reynolds had thrown a junior high weight discus. Stafford agreed he had a junior high discus in his bag as a good luck charm but denied he had thrown it. Since only the judge has the authority to disqualify a contestant and since the protest was not made to him when Stafford was throwing, Scott Brent of North Forsyth, the meet director, ruled that Stafford's throws counted.

Stafford was upset by the charge and did not throw in the finals. However, his afternoon throw was good enough to win first place.

Stafford also won the shot to be one of two double winners (Adams was the other).

In the 220-yard dash, a spectator bumped into Thomas Little of Reynolds, throwing him off stride. Little finished fourth.
