E. Meck captures boys title

WILMINGTON - Despite a firstplace finish by Providence's Justin Niedzialek (16 minutes, 24 seconds), East Mecklenburg held off

the Panthers by 10 points Saturday to win the boys cross-country meet at the Seahawk Invitational. Charlotte runners captured five of the top 10 places, with 139

runners competing from 22 schools in the boys division. "I felt all along that Providence had one of the top returning

squads in the state and so do we, East Mecklenburg coach Larry McAfee said. "I think it's going to be a tight battle all year long. It could flip-flop back and forth. We've got a talented group of athletes and they've got a talented group of athletes."

Said Niedzialek of the Panther's runner-up finish: "It showed me that we have a really strong team. Ever since I've been running, East Meck has been the team to beat. We've never beaten them. It shows that since we're close now we have a stronger team than ever."

Cary won the girls title as Providence finished fourth to take top honors among the Charlotte schools. Myers Park, East Mecklenburg and South Mecklenburg finished in the top 10 in the 23-team meet. The top Charlotte finisher was Providence's Kelly Wolfe, who finished eighth with a time of 21:23. She was four seconds ahead East Mecklenburg's

Mary Van Hellemont.

"That's a good early-season meet to see what the competition is like during the year," Providence girls coach Curt Niedenzu said. "It helps to see where we are." The meet allowed the Charlotte

schools to see some of the top schools from the east before the Oct. 1 Wendy's Invitational, the South's largest high school crosscounty meet. The state meet is Nov. 12. Both meets will be held at Charlotte's McAlpine Park.
